At the AGM, there were two changes in the membership of the Knocknagael Board. Steve Rowan stepped down as Director & Ged Church joined as our newest Director.

Our Chairman, Maria de La Torre said *'on behalf of all the Directors I would like to express a special thanks to Steve, who has been one of the founding Directors, and fundamental in driving the project forward from the start. He has played a major role in the organisation, helping Knocknagael develop into a company and charity. mour have helped us move forward. So we are glad that although not a Director, Steve continues to participate as a member and, temporarily, as Company Secretary.'

Ged Church is from London and has lived around and in Inverness since 1976. He studied zoology at London University and has worked as a Laboratory Scientist and school teacher in Scotland.

Other work has included self employment in garden and property maintenance, woodland learning and cycle maintenance. His interests are the natural world especially bird watching, walking, cycling and reading. He has been involved in community and national projects around cycling, walking and woodlands since 1989, and is an associate trustee of Aird Community Trust. He has been involved with the Inverness to Beauly Shared use route since the 1990s and has grown much of his family's food organically in garden and allotment for most of his adult life.



We have been successful in securing a small amount of funding from the Highlands and Islands Climate Action Fund to support another Apple Grafting Day. We are fortunate in having Des Kelly's expertise to draw upon, and the event will take place at Des and Kay's orchard at Torbreck on Saturday 20th April.
